Welcome to the latest edition of the Kaapuia paanui to keep whaanau, marae representatives and kaimahi of our entities updated on the ongoing progress of the Kaapuia review.

This edition provides more information on the Kaapuia review and highlights key developments from the last month.

Our tupuna awa brings life and wellbeing. Its waters nurture the whenua and sustains us both physically and spiritually. Where it moves to, we know there will be growth and development.

Our form, shape and the pathways we take are there to service our marae, whaanau and hapuu. The landscape for whaanau is changing, the challenges they face are increasing, and we need to consider if our structure best allows us to respond to these challenges.

In May 2022, marae representatives overwhelmingly supported the decision by Te Whakakitenga o Waikato to review our progress as a tribal entity.

Since then, Te Whakakitenga o Waikato has been on a journey to undertake a review of Waikato Tainui to ensure our organisation continues to serve the needs of marae, whaanau and hapuu.

On the 7th of October, Te Whakakitenga o Waikato resolved to consult and engage with marae, whaanau, hapuu and kaimahi on Ngaa Taunaki o Kaapuia, the proposed recommendations and options of the Kaapuia Komiti.

The Kaapuia Review has now moved into phase four which focuses on consultation and engagement

Waaahanga 1

Project initiation and desktop review: Stand up the project and understand the current structure.



Waaahanga 2

Waananga and stakeholder engagement: Listen to and understand the drivers and opportunities behind Kaapuia.



Waaahanga 3

Recommendations on changes to structure and rules: Summarise insights and co-develop structural options and rule change recommendations.



Waaahanga 4 - We are here

Consultation and engagement: Engage with marae, whaanau and hapuu, and consult with kaimahi.



Waaahanga 5

Implementation plan: Develop an implementation to be ratified by Te Whakakitenga o Waikato.

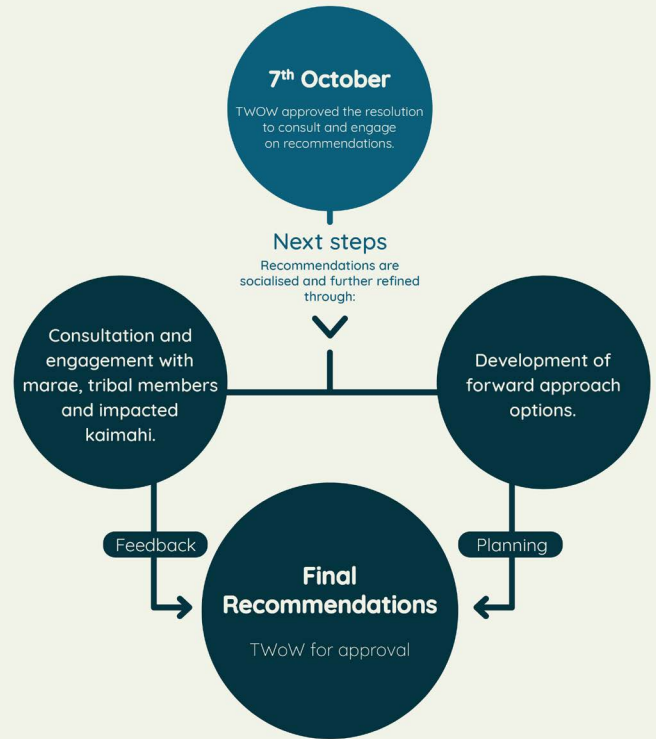
Next Steps

Once the engagement and consultation phase has been completed, the Kaapua Komiti will present the final recommendations to Te Whakakitenga o Waikato for its endorsement, including any required special resolutions.
